I, Bob Ingram, do hereby will my ability to hold orderly class meeting's to Lois Polen.

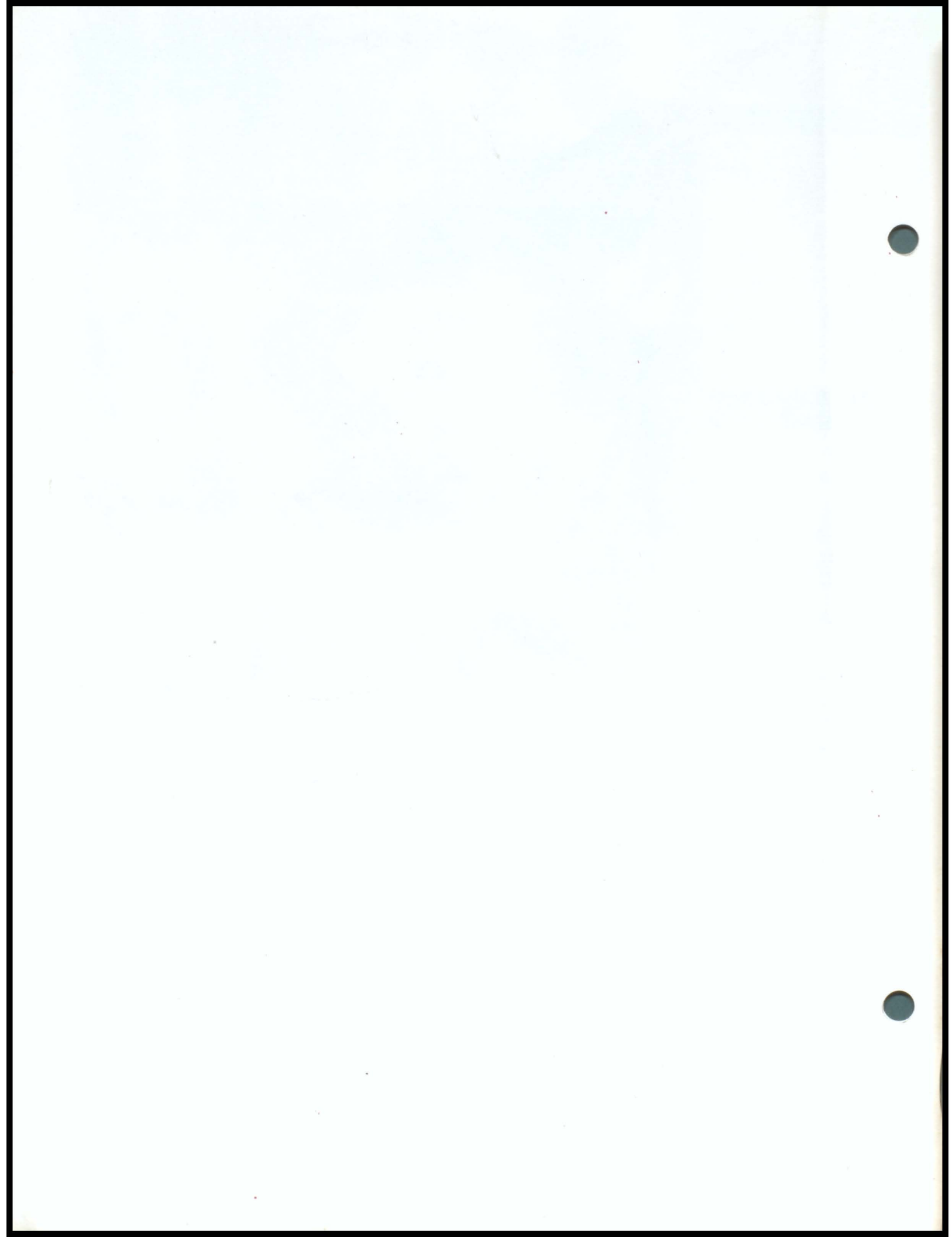
