


### Last Will and Cestament







Well, Mr. Hardin, I guess that takes care of all the students that graduated in '50. Most of them have done well for themselves. I just thought you might be interested.



We began to work on our Seniorplay rather early this year and gave it in March. The name of it was "Pigtails". Its cast consisted of eight girls and four boys.


During January and February weumdertookthe task of selling stationary. With a lot of hard work we managed to make a fair profit.







On November the 9, 1949 the Juniors of Kewanna High School were all excited and didn't exactly know which way to turn. After all that night they were to give their first school play.


