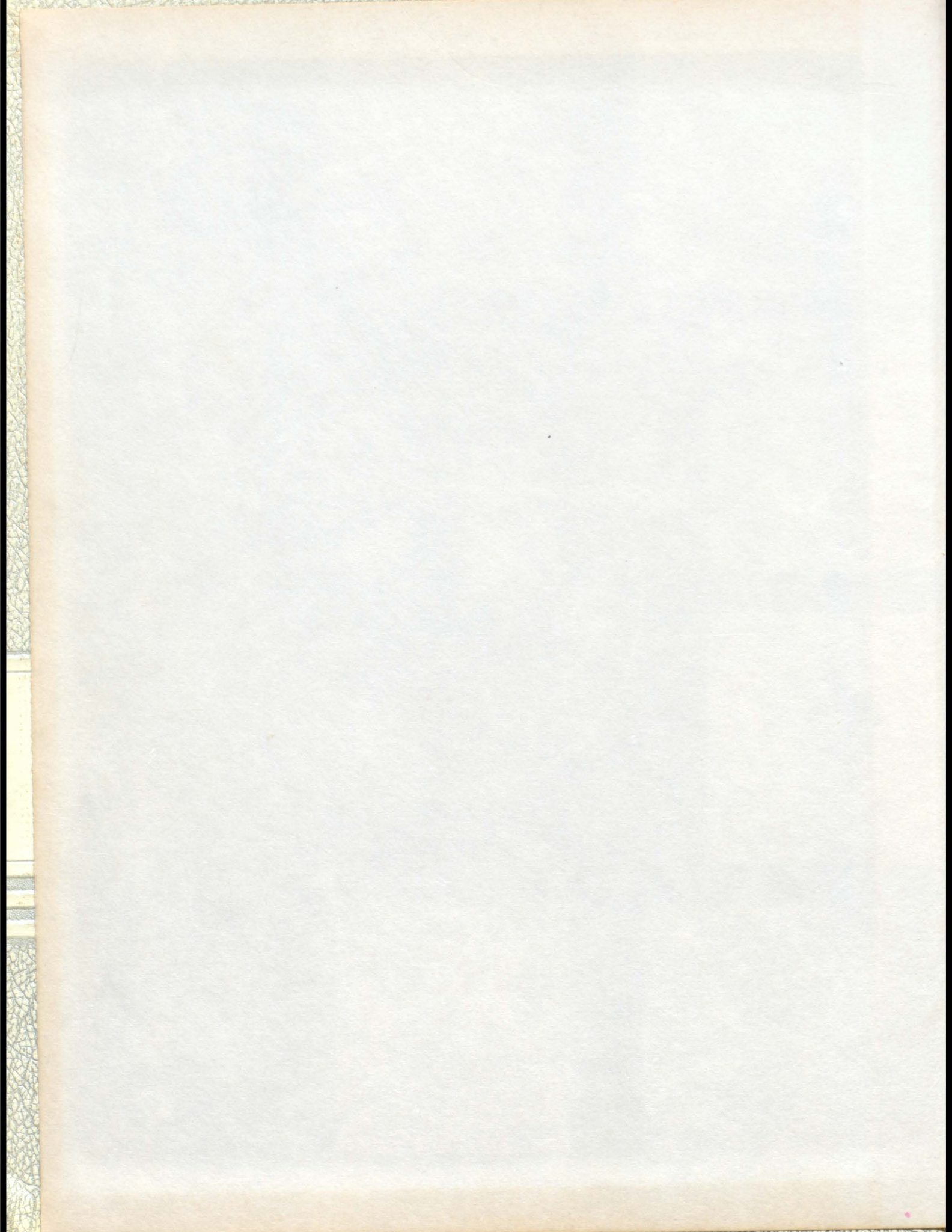

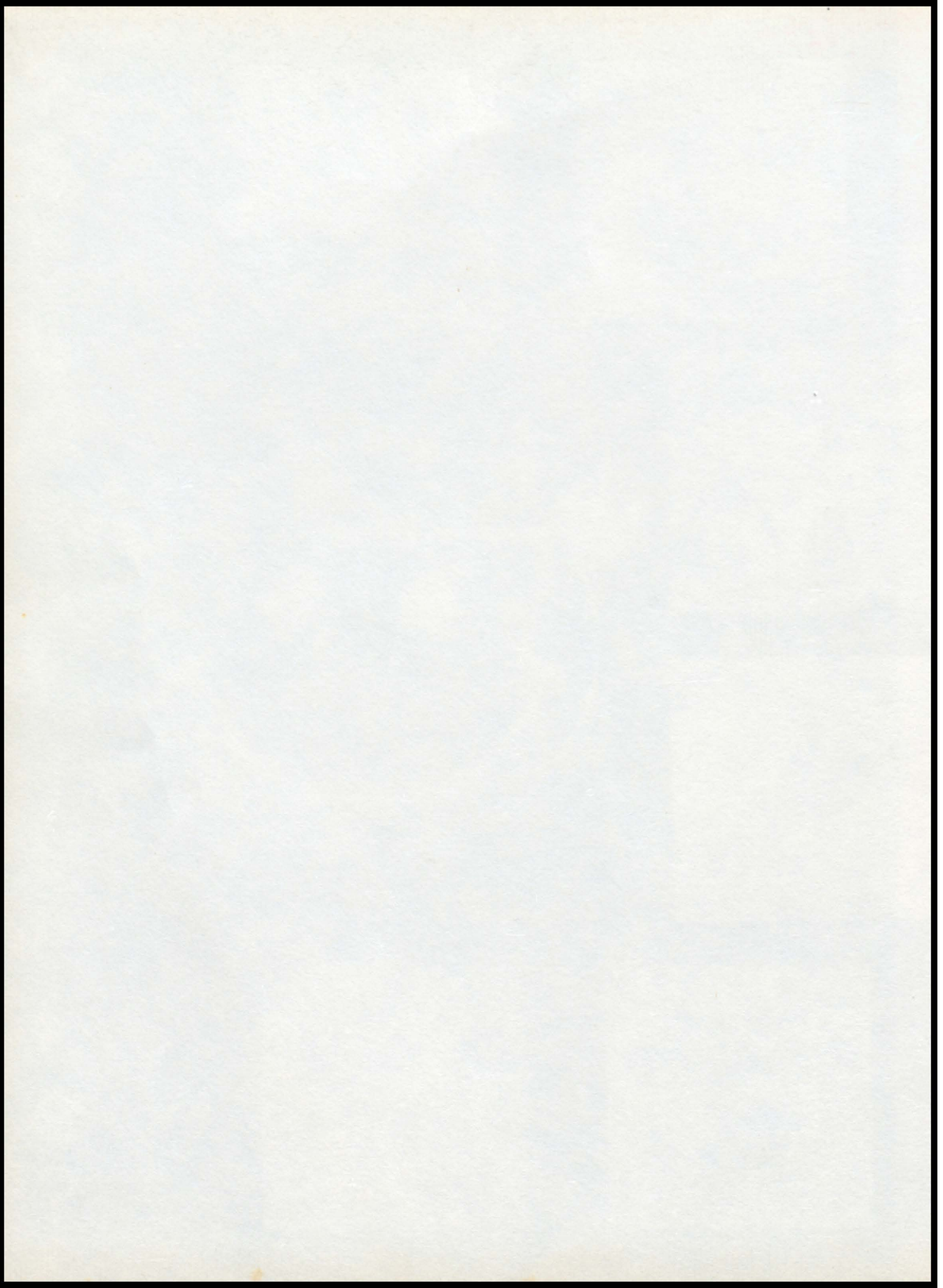

# FOREWORD

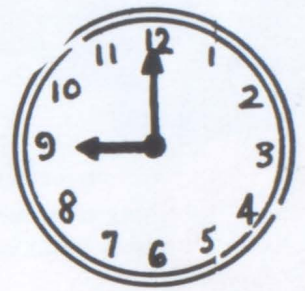


# MY HIGH SCHOOL RECORD

It may seem strange that this message is being written at this time, since the seniors seemingly can't profit too much by it. But can they? Can the rest of our student body profit by it?

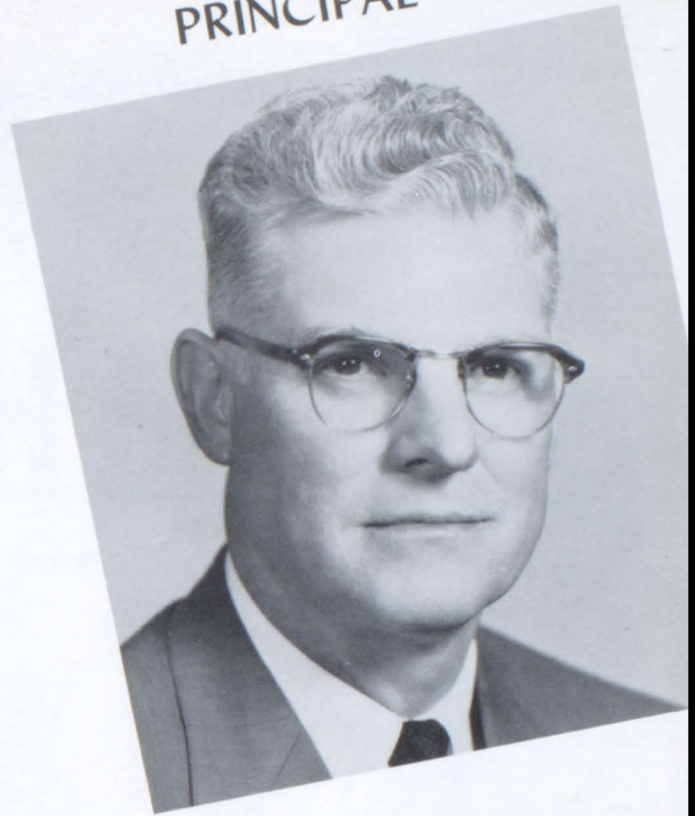
