Council hears recommendations on local healthcare

The Kewanna town council met with Dr. Steven Witz and Jillian Jweinat of the Regenstrief Center for Healthcare Engineering (RCHE) Tuesday evening at the town hall to hear their recommendations on healthcare in the local community. RCHE is part of Purdue University's Discovery Park and applies engineering and production concepts to healthcare delivery.

John Cochran, the town's former representative to the Fulton Economic Development Commission, gave opening remarks as he has been the contact person with RCHE for the town. Dr. Witz gave an overview of the work they do and then turned the meeting over to Ms Jweinat, a graduate student with a degree in health science.

She noted that to be eligible for a rural health clinic, the town must be located in a rural community and be determined as "underserved". The rural designation is a given and she believes that, after reviewing Census statistics, the town will be designated an underserved area.

Jweinat and Witz stressed that the town must first determine if residents in the community would support a rural health clinic. If there is enough interest, a survey will be conducted to determine if the town is eligible and then the town can apply for a federally-certified rural health clinic and eventually a federally qualified health clinic. The clinic would serve all residents but is geared especially to provide healthcare to residents that are underinsured or uninsured.

The town council will now have to determine if it wants to pursue any of the options put forth by RCHE.

Permits now needed

Kewanna residents are reminded that they now need a permit if they plan to build or remodel. In fact, all residents of Fulton County now need the permits to build, add a garage or deck, etc. Town of Kewanna residents can obtain their permits at the Kewanna Town Hall, 308 S. Logan Street. If you are a resident of the town, the permit is free as long as you acquire it before you start your building or remodeling project. If you live outside of the corporate limits you must get your permit from the Area Plan director, Suite 012, 125 E. 9th St., Rochester.

Grass Creek Lions receive grant from REMC

The Grass Creek Lions Club purchased the property formerly occupied by the Grass Creek School in 1987. Since that time, the Lions Club has maintained the 3½ acre site as a community park. Many improvements have been made to the property over the years.

In 1999, the old Grass Creek Depot was donated to the Lions Club and moved to the park. It has been restored to its original state. The depot is available to the community for meetings, birthday parties, graduation events, family reunions or church picnics. Lions Club members and residents of the community put in many hours of hard work during the restoration efforts. The money for the restoration was provided by the Fulton County Community Foundation, Fulton County Solid Waste, Lions Club International and Fulton County REMC.

Other improvements to the park include the renovation of the old pavilion, new playground equipment, new picnic tables and benches, and new storage shed for the newly acquired lawn mower. The park is mowed every week during the summer by a volunteer from the Lions Club.

The Lions Club has been aided in its project by members of the community who have donated flower bulbs, plants and shrubs for landscaping. The Key Club from Caston School helped with the landscaping and installation of the playground equipment. A master gardener, Linda Herd, donated her time and materials for a flower garden in the park.

(STATEHOUSE) - Gov. Mitch Daniels' State of the State address last Tuesday reflected on Indiana's successes in 2007 and the plan of action for this year. Throughout the address, we were all reminded how great it is to live in Indiana.

Questions & Answers About Our Environment

Dear EarthTalk: My uncle worked for over a decade on the top floor of an office building with cell phone towers directly above him. He was recently diagnosed with cancer. Is there any scientific evidence of links between exposure to cell phone tower radiation and cancer? --Jennifer L., Wellesley, MA

No one doubts that cell phone towers give off low-level radiofrequency radiation (similar to the microwave oven in your home), but scientists are still debating the health effects of long-term exposure. Some people are genetically predisposed to certain types of cancers, while others are not (for example, some lifelong smokers get lung cancer while others don't). And with so many different chemicals, pollutants and other substances around us in our air, food and water, it is very difficult to determine with particular if a certainty environmental influence (such as a cell phone tower) is the culprit when health problems, such as cancer, arise in a particular locale or among certain populations.

But that hasn't stopped many communities from worrying about this issue and taking measures. In San cautionary Francisco, for instance, individuals concerned and

have neighborhood groups San Francisco formed the Antenna-Free Neighborhood Union (SNAFU) for the purpose of preventing "the placement of wireless antennas on or near residences, schools, health care centers, day care centers, senior centers, playgrounds, places of worship, and other inappropriate locations..."

SNAFU is worried that San Francisco is "already immersed in of electromagnetic a sea radiation" from, among other sources, some 2,500 licensed cell phone antennas at 530 locations around the city. The group is distributing petitions calling on local public officials to increase "restrictions on the number and location of cellular phone antennas and other wireless transmitters." Other controversies have erupted in communities in Connecticut and elsewhere over churches renting their rooftops and steeples to cell phone companies for placement of And parents in antennas. Ossining, New York waged an unsuccessful battle in 2000 to ban revenue-generating cell towers from school grounds.

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
