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### Pancake and sausage breakfast, May 25



The museum is located four miles north of Rochester on U.S. 31 and is open from 9 to 5 Monday through Saturday, except for holidays.

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

## Managing Small Ruminant Parasites

Purdue Extension will be holding a workshop on managing internal parasites in sheep and goats highlighting FAMACHA. FAMACHA is a parasite management system that is proactive in fighting these pests. Program will be held on Thursday evening, May 29, at the Marshall County Fairgrounds located in Argos, Indiana, on Highway 10. It will start at 6:30 pm and end by 9:00 pm.

Internal parasites are a significant threat facing today's sheep and goat producers. Small ruminants tend to be more sensitive to internal parasites than other grazing livestock, which can result in irreversible damage or even death to the animal, reduced performance and economic loss for producers. There are only three classes of drugs available to control internal parasites in small ruminants. If over utilized, internal parasites can develop resistance to various classes of dewormers and make controlling these pests very difficult.

At this workshop,

participants will learn about internal parasites that impact sheep and goats, anthelmintics (dewormers) available to reduce internal parasite numbers, and become certified to use FAMACHA; an internal parasite management system.

FAMACHA is a new method for the treatment and control of *Haemonchus contortus* (Barber's Pole worm) the primary internal pest for sheep and goats. The goal of this system is to decrease amount and frequency of treatment for the majority of the herd, slow down the development of anthelmintic resistance, and move a flock or herd towards higher tolerance to internal parasites.

Dr. Mike Neary, Purdue University Small Ruminant Specialist, will be the primary speaker for the program. He will spend one hour in a classroom setting discussing small ruminant internal parasites and outline the FAMACHA system. DR. Richard Leeper DVM with the Bourbon Veterinary Hospital will share the value of having a good working relationship with a veterinarian for managing internal parasites and overall herd

health. Following this presentation, we will have a "hands-on" demonstration on utilizing FAMACHA to evaluate a group of sheep and goats.

Pre-registration is required for this program by Tuesday, May 27, to have enough packets available for FAMACHA certification. There is a fee of \$15 per family/farm to attend this program to cover FAMACHA packet cost.
