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Spring brings threat of tick-transmitted diseases

Warm weather season means Hoosiers will increase outdoor activities that may lead to encounters with disease-carrying ticks.

State health officials advise Hoosiers to take precautions when outdoors to avoid contact with ticks because they may carry Lyme disease, Rocky Mountain spotted fever, Tularemia or Ehrlichiosis.

"When outdoor temperatures rise, ticks become active," said James Howell, D.V.M., veterinary epidemiologist, Indiana State Department of Health. "Ticks, like mosquitoes, are carriers of a number of diseases. All ticks should be considered infectious and capable of transmitting diseases, even though most are not."

"We know in order to become ill, an individual must be bitten by an infected tick through exposed skin," said Dr. Howell. "A little care can prevent that from happening."

Health officials recommend if individuals plan to enter a grassy or wooded area where ticks are often present, the best way to prevent tick-transmitted diseases is to wear a long-sleeved shirt and light-colored pants, with the shirt tucked in at the waist and the pants tucked into socks. The use of repellents provides even more protection.

Insect repellents containing DEET or picaridin can be sprayed on both skin and clothing to repel ticks and other insects. People who expect to be exposed to tick habitat for extended periods of time should use products containing permethrin on their clothing. Permethrin is an insecticide that kills ticks and other insects on contact.

Dr. Howell recommends after leaving a grassy or wooded area, people should check for ticks on clothing and skin. He says ticks need to be attached for several hours to a couple of days before they can infect an individual.

"If a tick is attached to your skin, it can be removed with either tweezers or forceps by grasping the tick as close to the skin as possible," Dr. Howell said. "Ticks should not be removed with bare fingers, but if tweezers or forceps are not available, you can use tissue paper or a paper towel to prevent the passing of any possible infection."

Lyme disease is often associated with a persistent, slowly expanding blotchy red rash which is usually fainter at the center than at the edges. Other signs and symptoms include joint pain or swelling, especially in the knees; fatigue, difficulty in concentrating, headache, stiff neck or weakness of the facial muscles, dizziness and an irregular heartbeat.

Mountain spotted fever, Ehrlichiosis and Tularemia are similar. They include a moderate-to-high fever, coupled with fatigue, muscle aches and pains, severe headaches and chills. With Rocky Mountain spotted fever a rash may also develop shortly after disease onset, first appearing on the arms, legs, palms of the hand and soles of the feet before spreading to other parts of the body.

According to Dr. Howell, if these diseases are diagnosed promptly, all of them can be successfully treated with antibiotics.

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Signup starts for habitat practice

The Indiana Farm Service Agency (FSA) has begun enrolling acres under a new Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) practices titled "State Acres for Wildlife Habitat" or SAFE. The USDA approved Indiana's SAFE project, which provides for 13,100 acres to be devoted to four project areas for the purpose of benefiting specific threatened and endangered species in Indiana. The SAFE practices will target the habitat rehabilitation of the Northern Bobwhite Quail, Henslow's Sparrow, Sedge Wren/Grass-hopper Sparrow, and Indiana Bat.

Fulton County is included in the priority areas for Northern Bobwhite Quail and the Indiana Bat.

Producers that own or operate acreage located within one of the approved SAFE areas can submit offers to voluntarily enroll acres in CRP contracts for 10 to 15 years. In exchange, producers receive annual rental payments, incentives, and cost-share assistance to establish habitat-enhancing covers on eligible land.

Through Continuous CRP signup, FSA will accept offers into SAFE year-round provided the land and producers meet certain eligibility requirements. Some of the eligibility requirements include:

- Acreage must be cropland and located in one of the State's four SAFE priority areas.
- Cropland must have been cropped four out of six years from 1996 to 2001.
- Expired or expiring CRP is eligible for enrollment provided it is offered before June 1 of the year following contract expiration.
- Owned or operated land for a minimum of 12 months prior to offering acreage for enrollment.

Each of the four priority areas have national acreage enrollment limit. Therefore, offers will be accepted by FSA until the acreage allocation is reached. 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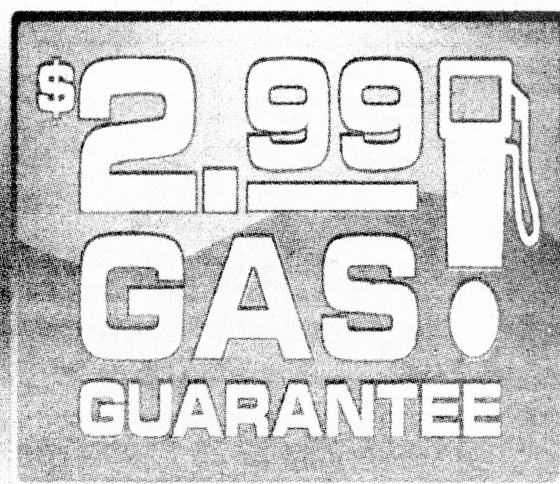
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
