## The News In Brief

According to Norm Steigely, chairman of the Lake Bruce Conservancy board of directors, Kamphus Pipeline Company will compete the laying of pipe for the conservancy's new sewage collection and treatment system this week. The entire project is scheduled for completion by October.

BP announced last week that it is moving ahead with the planned \$3.8 billion expansion of its Whiting refinery despite legal challenges to air and water permits the state approved for the project.

Oil prices plunged to a three-month low Monday. The steep drop in the price of crude oil has also dragged down the price of other commodities, adding to growing beliefs that the oil bubble is at least temporarily deflating.

U.S. health officials reported last week that the number of Americans infected by the AIDS virus each year is much higher than the government has been estimating. The country had about 56,300 new HIV infections in 2006 - a dramatic increase from the 40,000 annual estimate used for the last dozen years. The new figure is due to a better blood test and new statistical methods, and not worsening of the epidemic.

Bruce Ivins, the chief suspect in the anthrax attacks that took place shortly after the 9-11 attack, has committed suicide.

NIPSCO has announced that natural gas prices for August decreased compared to last month, due mainly to a decrease in wholesale natural gas prices. NIPSCO residential customers will see a decrease in natural gas costs of 12.17 percent when compared to July.

Ivy Tech Community College Logansport will offer three open registration days for students. Advisors will be on hand August 7, 14 and 18 from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. to advise students and enroll them in classes for the upcoming fall semester that begins August 25.

The federal minimum wage increased from \$5.85 to \$6.55 per hour July 24. Indiana is one of 10 states that used federal minimum guidelines to determine its own minimum wage rate. Indiana has 36,000 workers earning minimum wage.

## Farm Bill offers "buy- in" fee

Kenny Culp, Executive Director for USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Indiana announced recently that the Agency will allow producers who would otherwise be ineligible for the new disaster assistance programs to become eligible by paying a fee as required by the 2008 Farm Bill.

The bill requires producers who wish to participate in the new disaster programs to have crop insurance or non-insured crop disaster assistance (NAP) coverage for the land for which assistance is being requested, and for all farms in all counties in which they have an interest. Since the 2008 Farm Bill was enacted after the application periods had closed for those programs, producers who did not have such coverage could not comply with this requirement in order to be eligible for the new disaster programs. However, the Farm Bill authorizes a waiver that allows producers to pay a fee, called a "buy-in" fee, to be eligible for this new disaster assistance.

"I urge every producer whose crops, including grazing lands, are not fully covered by crop insurance or NAP to take advantage of this one-time opportunity," Culp said. "The buy-in fee is due no later than Sept. 16, 2008, 90 days after the date of enactment, as required by the Farm Bill. If you miss this opportunity you will not be eligible for disaster assistance. I also want to remind producers that the payment of the applicable buy-in fee does not afford the producer crop insurance or NAP coverage, it only affords eligibility for the 2008 disaster programs."

The crop insurance and NAP coverage requirements will be

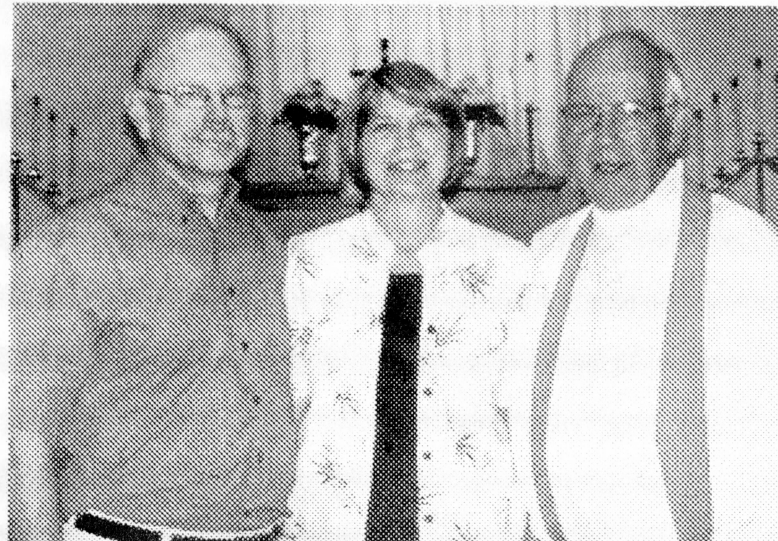

## NOTICE OF REAL PROPERTY TAX SALE

Pursuant to the laws of the Indiana General Assembly, notice is hereby given that the following described property is listed for sale for delinquent taxes and/or special assessments. The county auditor and county treasurer will apply on or after 8/19/2008 for a court judgment against the tracts or real property for an amount that is not less than the amount set out below and for an order to sell the tracts or real property at public auction to the highest bidder, subject to the right of redemption. Any defense to the application for judgment must be filed with the Fulton County CIRCUIT Court before 8/19/2008. The court will set a date for a hearing at least seven (7) days before the advertised date of sale and the court will determine any defenses to the application for judgment at the hearing. Such sale will be held 9/5/2008 at the Commissioners Room and that sale will continue until all tracts and real property have been offered for sale.

Property will not be sold for an amount which is less than the sum of:

- (A) the delinquent taxes and special assessments on each tract or item of real property; and
- (B) the taxes and special assessments on the real property that are due and payable in the year of the sale, whether or not they are delinquent; and
- (C) all penalties due on the delinquencies; and
- (D) an amount prescribed by the county auditor that equals the sum of:
  - (1) twenty-five(\$25) for postage and publication costs; and
  - (2) any other costs incurred by the county that are directly attributable to the tax sale; and
- (E) any unpaid costs due, under subsection (b), from a prior tax sale; and

The 2007 pay 2008 taxes have not been determined as of the date of this notice. The amounts listed for the minimum bids include an estimate of the entire 2007 pay 2008 taxes. The estimate was calculated by adding the 2006 pay 2007 first and second installments together and then adding an additional five percent (5%). There may be additional taxes due resulting from actual amounts calculated for 2007 payable 2008. If the actual 2007 pay 2008 taxes are calculated at the time of the sale, the minimum bids will be changed to reflect the actual amounts.

To remove a property from the tax sale the entire Amount for Judgment must be paid. No property listed below shall be sold if, at any time before the sale the Total Amount for Judgment is paid in full. If the real property is sold in the tax sale, the amount required to redeem such property will be 110% of the minimum bid for which the tract or real property was offered at the time of sale, as required by IC 6-1.1-24.5 if redeemed not more than six (6) months after the date of sale, or 115% of the minimum bid for which the tract or real property was offered at the time of sale, as required by IC 6-1.1-24.5 if redeemed more than six (6) months after the date of sale, plus the amount by which the purchase price exceeds the minimum bid on the real property plus ten percent (10%) per annum on the amount by which the purchase price exceeds the minimum bid on the property. All taxes and special assessments upon the property paid by the purchaser subsequent to the sale, plus 10% per annum interest on those taxes and special assessments, will also be required to be paid to redeem such property. In addition, IC 6-1.1-25-2 (e) states the total amount required for redemption may include the following costs incurred and paid by the purchaser or the purchaser's assignee or the county before redemption: (1) The attorney's fees and cost of giving notice under IC 6-1.1-25-4.5. (2) The costs of title search or examining and update the abstract of title for the tract or item of real property. The period of redemption shall expire one year from the date of sale for a property sold on the tax sale. The period of redemption may expire one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of sale for a property not sold in the tax sale if the county intends to pursue title to the parcel.

If the tract or item of real property is sold for an amount more than the minimum bid and the property is not redeemed, the owner of record of the property who is divested of ownership at the time the tax deed is issued may have a right to the tax sale surplus.

The Auditor and Treasurer specifically reserve the right to withhold from the sale any parcel which has been listed in error, or which otherwise become ineligible for sale either prior to 9/5/2008 or during the duration of the sale.

This notice of real property tax sale, and the tax sale itself are undertaken and will be conducted pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of Indiana which regulate the sale of land for delinquent taxes, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-1 et seq.

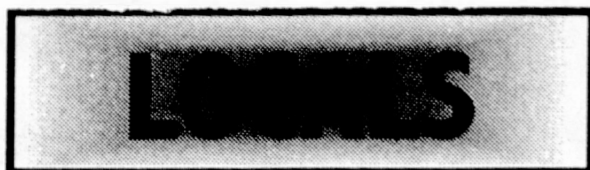

waived in 2008 for producers who did not obtain crop insurance or NAP coverage by the applicable sales closing date, if the producer files an application for waiver and pays a buy-in fee in an amount equal to the 2008 applicable NAP coverage or catastrophic risk protection plan fee for the crop or grazing lands.

Producers who meet the definition of "Socially Disadvantaged, Limited Resource," or "Beginning Farmer or Rancher" do not have to meet the Risk Management Purchase Requirement, and, therefore, are not required to pay the buy-in fee.

The buy-in fee for 2008 eligibility for either the catastrophic risk protection insurance (CAT) or NAP is \$100 per crop, but not more than \$300 per producer per administrative county, or \$900 total per producer for all counties less any previously paid fees for CAT and/or NAP. Producers can contact their local administrative FSA County Office to file the application for waiver and pay the applicable fee.

The applicable buy-in form must be completed and applicable fees paid by Sept. 16, 2008. Payment of the applicable fees will allow the producer to be eligible for benefits for losses under Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments (SURE) Program, Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP), Tree Assistance Program (TAP), and Emergency Assistance Livestock, Honeybees and Farm-Raised Fish Program (ELAP).

The Farm Bill authorizes funds to be used to make payments to

farmers and ranchers incurring eligible crop production/quality losses under the SURE Program, grazing losses under LFP, livestock death losses under LIP, and losses suffered by producers of livestock, honeybees, and farm-raised fish under ELAP. The 2008 Act also authorizes TAP.

To be eligible for SURE, TAP, and ELAP, producers must meet the Risk Management Purchase Requirement by purchasing at least the CAT level of crop insurance for all insurable crops and/or NAP coverage for non-insurable crops. To be eligible for LFP, producers must meet the Risk Management Purchase Requirement by purchasing or obtaining for the grazing land incurring the losses where assistance is being requested, a policy or plan of insurance under the Federal Crop Insurance Act, including pilot programs such as the Pasture, Rangeland, Forage Program (PRF) or NAP coverage by filing the required paperwork and paying the administrative fee by the applicable state filing deadline. The Risk Management Purchase Requirement does not apply to LIP.

The SURE program will be available to eligible producers on farms in disaster counties, designated by the Secretary, including contiguous counties that have incurred crop production losses and/or crop quality losses during the crop year. It also will be available to any farm where, during the calendar year, the total loss of production on the farm, because of weather, is greater than 50 percent of the normal production of the farm.

The LFP program will be available to eligible livestock producers who suffered grazing losses for eligible livestock, because of drought on land that is either native or improved pastureland with permanent vegetative cover or planted to a crop specifically for providing grazing. The LFP program will also be available to eligible livestock producers who suffered losses for eligible livestock, because of fire on rangeland managed by a Federal agency, if the eligible livestock producer is prohibited from grazing the normal permitted livestock on the managed rangeland.

The LIP program will be available to eligible livestock producers on farms that have incurred livestock death losses in excess of normal mortality, because of adverse weather, as determined by the Secretary during the calendar year, including losses because of hurricanes, floods, blizzards, disease, wildfires, extreme heat and extreme cold.

The TAP program provides assistance to orchardists and eligible nursery tree growers who produce nursery, ornamental, fruit, nut or Christmas trees for commercial sale that lost trees, bushes, or vines, because of a natural disaster, as determined by the Secretary.

The ELAP program will provide emergency relief to producers of livestock, honey bees, and farm-raised fish, because of losses from adverse weather or other conditions, such as blizzards and wildfires, as determined by the Secretary.

Because Congress did not provide a rulemaking exception for these programs, FSA must first publish a proposed rule seeking public comment.

followed by a final rule. FSA is working to develop detailed regulations and software for these programs. Sign up for these programs is not expected to be held until this winter.

*Phone doctors give advice that could help your cell phone survive*

For many people, summer means cooling off at a pool, lake or the beach. But what should you do if your cell phone accidentally gets dunked?

U.S. Cellular's wireless experts offer tips to improve the chances that your phone will survive a dive.

**Power down** - If your phone doesn't turn itself off when it gets wet, power it down right away. Once the power is off, remove the battery.

**Moment of truth** - Once you replace the battery, push the "on" button. If the phone turns on, you can breathe a sigh of relief. However, check your keypad. Keys that stick or don't work all the time are signs of permanent damage. U.S. Cellular's phone doctors say it will likely get worse with time. If you have phone insurance, most policies require you to report the damage within 90 days of the incident.

**Get technical** - service technicians might be able to help. You should bring a wet phone to a service technician as soon as possible.

**Don't lose your contacts, too** - If your phone can't be revived, your old phone's address book can be easily loaded onto your new phone if you have My Contacts Backup, a free service offered to easyedge<sup>SM</sup> customers.

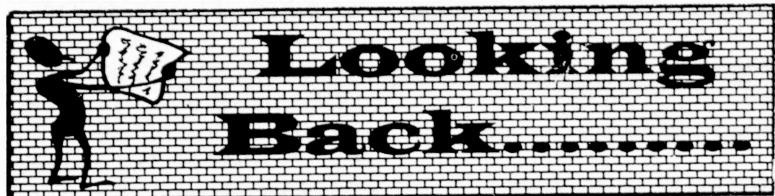

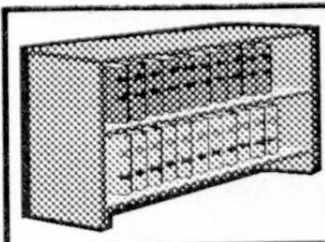

## SALMONELLA, How To Avoid It...

Salmonella is a type of bacterium that lives in the intestinal tracts of some animals, and can live in soil and water for months.

Once salmonella has contaminated something, it can be spread from surface to surface. A tomato contaminated with salmonella can spread the bacterium to the hands of a person who cuts the tomato and to the cutting board on which the tomato is sliced.

### What kind of illness does salmonella cause?

- Fever
- Diarrhea (which may be bloody)
- Nausea, vomiting
- Abdominal pain

Salmonella may be more serious or fatal in young children, frail or elderly people, and people with weakened immune systems. Symptoms usually last four to seven days and most people get better without treatment.

### What can I do to prevent salmonellosis?

- Cook poultry, ground beef and eggs thoroughly. Do not eat or drink foods containing raw eggs, or raw (non-pasteurized) milk.
- If you are seared undercooked meat,

poultry or eggs in a restaurant, don't hesitate to send it back to the kitchen for further cooking.

- Wash hands, kitchen work surfaces and utensils with soap and water immediately after they have been in contact with raw meat or poultry.
- Be particularly careful with foods prepared for infants or the elderly.
- Wash hands with soap after handling reptiles, birds or baby chicks and after contact with pet feces.
- Avoid direct or even indirect contact between reptiles (turtles, iguanas or other lizards, snakes) and infants.
- Don't work with raw poultry or meat and an infant (e.g., feed, change diaper) at the same time.
- Mother's milk is the safest food for young infants. Breastfeeding prevents salmonella and many other health problems.
