The News In Brief

A traditional Thanksgiving dinner will cost Hoosier families less this year, according to an informal statewide survey of grocery store prices coordinated by Indiana Farm Bureau. But, even though the total cost for the holiday dinner is down in Indiana, the state's average cost is still slightly higher than the national average for similar Thanksgiving fare.

Indiana lawmakers gathered at the Statehouse in Indianapolis Tuesday, Nov. 18, for an organizational day, which included oaths of office for State Representatives and Senators.

Despite the fact that the facility receives town water, police patrol and utilizes the town's streets, it remains outside the corporate limits by a few feet.

This writer urges the Kewanna town board to annex the North Central facility into the corporate limits so they may pay their fair share of taxes as do the residents and other businesses in Kewanna and to conform to the local ordinances regarding noise, etc.




