The Lake Bruce Conservancy District held its monthly meeting jointly with the Lake Bruce Association's annual meeting Thursday, August 9, in the community room of the Kewanna-Union Township Fire Station. All five directors were present as well as nine freeholders of the district and two guests.

Chairman Norm Steigely once again reminded everyone that the district's web site, [www.LBCD.info](http://www.LBCD.info), is being updated on a regular basis to keep the people of the district informed on what is going on. He also announced that the district has finally received a title policy on the railroad property that was purchased from CSX.

It was reported that the board of directors is still working on a sewer rate ordinance but must get actual numbers of units that will be serviced at Hoosier Hideaway before they can move forward.

Steigely reported that he has been in touch with J F New & Associates, the company that is overseeing the dredging project, about the procedure on replacing damaged field tiles at the holding site. J F New & Associates will be in touch with Tennent Dredging and get back with the district on their findings.

A new option to replace the expired option on the Rude property for the treatment plant was approved and he was paid \$500 for the new option. New language was added stating that the district would repair and maintain the main drainage line that runs across the rear of the property.

Steven Fralish of Wightman Petrie gave his monthly progress report on the sewer project. He expects the project to go to bid in September. The board unanimously approved a motion to allow Wightman Petrie to advertise bids as soon as the required paperwork has been completed. He also mentioned that there would be a hearing on a zoning change at the Fulton County courthouse on September 12 for the railroad property to enable the district to place an office/meeting hall and a vacuum plant on the site.

Steve Carter of Umbaugh & Associates guided the group through the initial introduction of the bond ordinance required by the federal loan. The final adoption of the bond ordinance will take place at a special meeting on August 30. Director Rick Tompos, a CPA, will be looking over the ordinance prior to the meeting.

Director and lake enhancement chairman, Gerald Porter, gave a brief presentation on the spraying done by Weed Patrol this past

Treasurer Dave Foust mentioned that the budget process for 2008 started August 6 when he and assistant treasurer, Rick Tompos, met with the state budget people. The budget is being published in two newspapers as required and a special meeting will be held for the first reading on August 30. The adoption will take place at the next regular meeting on September 13. He wanted to make sure that all in attendance understands that no tax revenues are being raised for the sewer project in the budget and that the sewer project is totally funded by user fees and grant monies.

Foust tendered his resignation from the board and the treasurer's position effective after the September 13 meeting as he will be moving to Plymouth. It was accepted by the board and he was commended for his faithful years of service to the board and the people of Lake Bruce. The board unanimously voted director Rick Tompos into the office of treasurer effective upon Dave's departure. The board will appoint a replacement to take Foust's place on the board until elections in February. Any freeholder wanting to fill this seat should contact any of the current directors.

The meeting was adjourned at 8 p.m. Future scheduled meetings include the special meeting to be held August 30 to introduce the budget and sewer rate ordinance; the regular meeting on September 13 when the 2008 budget will be adopted; and a special meeting on September 20 to adopt the sewer ordinance. All meetings will be held in the fire station community room at 7 p.m.

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## Republicans Chose Candidates for Fall Election

Kewanna Republicans held a convention in the community room of the Kewanna-Union Township Fire Station Tuesday evening to select candidates for the fall town election.

The presiding officer was Jack Urbin, chairman of the Republican town committee. He was assisted by Bev Baldwin, secretary.

Candidates for the three seats on the Kewanna town council, which serve at-large, were Dan Birge, Jeffrey Finke, Mark Smith and Don Woolington. Birge, Finke and Smith were selected to appear on the fall ballot.

Jennifer Kay defeated Bev Ton for the position of town clerk-treasurer. Jennifer will serve as the next clerk-treasurer as no one filed on the Democrat ticket for that position.

The Democrats will not hold a town convention, as only one candidate filed for election. Alan McPherson has filed for a spot on the town council. Voters in the town election on November 6 will select three persons to fill the town council seats for the next four years.

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## Enlistment Bonus Offered

Regular Army recruits with no prior military service who enlist at least two years and report for training before Sept. 30 may be eligible for a \$20,000 enlistment bonus.

This bonus can be combined with other existing cash enlistment bonuses. The maximum combination of bonuses for a four-year enlistment is \$40,000.

Cash bonuses may also be combined with either the Army College Fund or student Loan Repayment Program. The Army College Fund, available to high school diploma graduates who volunteer to serve in high-priority skill specialties, offers up to \$72,900 for higher education in combination with the Montgomery G.I. Bill. The Loan Repayment Program, open to all recruits with qualifying federally-funded student loans who enlist for at least three years in any occupational specialty, can repay up to \$65,000.

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## Drainage 101 Seminar Offered Again



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

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
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Thirty Years Ago August 11, 1977




