Public Hearing September 6 Attendees Needed!

A public hearing will be held at 7 p.m. Thursday, September 6, in conjunction with the monthly Kewanna town council meeting on the town's application for a Community Focus Fund grant from the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs. The grant, along with local funds and an interest-free loan from FEDCO, will be used to upgrade the local sewage treatment plant.

The work at the sewage treatment plant is imperative, but the town must secure a grant in order to perform the work without raising sewage bills.

IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT KEWANNA RESIDENTS ATTEND THIS PUBLIC HEARING AND EXPRESS THEIR APPROVAL OF THE WORK AND THE GRANT APPLICATION. A good attendance at the public hearing will give the town more "points" in the scoring process for the grant application. During the last grant round, the town missed the grant cut-off by 18 points. The hearing will be the first item on the agenda and those present for the hearing can leave as soon as it is over, if they choose.



Local Bank Getting Drive-Up - Zagajewski Construction, Inc. of Logansport is installing a drive-up window at the Kewanna branch of Community State Bank. Elizabeth Swirn Celebrates 105th Birthday

Elizabeth Frances Arndt Swirn observed her 105th birthday Tuesday, August 21. She is the only living immediate family member of the late Antonia Agatha Arndt Gudas of the Star City/Kewanna area. Mrs. Swirn lived in Foley, Alabama until this past year when she had to go into the hospital to have her pacemaker batteries changed. She now resides near her daughter and son-in-law, Dolores (Swirn) and Archie Kouns and their families in Pensacola, Florida. Her husband of 47 years, Andrew Swirn, passed away April 12, 1968, and is buried in Pine Rest Cemetery near

Magnolia Springs, Alabama. Andrew was an immigrant to the United States from Lithuania. Although Elizabeth's parents, Karl (Charlie) and Constance Barboshaite Arndt were from Vilkaviskis, Lithuania, they lived in Essen, Germany, on 22 AM Freistein Strasse where Elizabeth and several older siblings were born. Karl worked for the Krupp Ammunition plant in Essen. The family emigrated to the U.S. in the early 1900s and first settled in Detroit, Michigan, where Karl worked in the ship yard.

As numerous Lithuanian friends were moving to a warmer climate, the Arndts moved to Foley in 1910 where they pioneered and cleared land for their home and farm.

An early celebration of Elizabeth's birthday was held July 22 at Hemingways in Pensacola. In attendance were her daughter and son-in-law, Dolores and Archie Kouns and their families. The Kouns also celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary at the time. This was also an early observance as they were married in September. They have five children, Michael and Trish Kouns of Pensacola; Lt. Col. USMC Ret. Don and Karen Abblitt of Wilmington, Delaware; Kale Kouns; Kim and Tammy Kouns of Pensacola; and Jason and Wendy Kouns of Halls Cross Road, Tennessee. Included in the

celebration were their grandchildren and their families. In addition to the 28 Swirn relatives in attendance were Elizabeth's niece and her husband, Millie and Robert Redweik of Kewanna; her great-niece, Susan Redweik Wood and daughter Kailee Baird of Jeffersonville, Ohio; and her great-nephew, Robert John Redweik, Jr. and daughters Madison, Kirsten and Lanier of Tomball, Texas.

A sad note to the event was that Elizabeth's son, Richard, passed away just prior to the festivities.

The "2nd" One Million Pop Tabs and Counting...

Dorothy Morgan and Peg Schultz of Francesville, both members of the Pulaski Memorial Hospital Auxiliary, coordinate the collection of pop tabs and deliver them once a year to the Ronald McDonald House associated with Riley Children's Hospital in Indianapolis.

It takes one thousand pounds to equal one million tabs. With this year's delivery, the volunteers are working on their "second" one million goal, with a delivery of 543 pounds of pop tabs.

The pop tabs are used to finance housing and food expenses for families of children who are hospitalized, and are unable to pay these expenses for themselves.

The project began five years ago when Dorothy's granddaughter, a member of an Indianapolis Brownie Troop, was collecting pop tabs. Dorothy got some collection boxes and took the idea to the Midwest Area Auxiliaries.

The project, adopted by the Midwest Area Auxiliaries representing nine area hospitals, has grown every year.

"Several individuals and churches save the pop tabs and

donate them to the Auxiliary. We welcome anyone to join us in this effort," Dorothy said.



More than 540 pounds of bagged, boxed and bottled pop tabs were delivered by Dorothy Morgan and Peg Schultz, both members of the Pulaski Memorial Hospital Auxiliary. 

The condition of the vinyl/asbestos flooring and other areas are monitored on a regular basis as required by the Asbestos HAZER Act (AHERA) regulations.


