Kewanna Town Election, Nov. 6

An election will be held Tuesday, November 6, to elect a Kewanna town council and clerk-treasurer. Balloting will be in the community room of the Kewanna-Union Township Fire Station, 404 N. Toner Street and polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. local time.

Positions to be filled include the Kewanna town council, three at-large positions, and the clerk-treasurer's office.

There are four candidates for the three-member town council. They are Republicans Dan Birge, Jeffrey Finke and Mark Smith and Democrat, Alan McPherson. Finke is an incumbent; Birge is a former town council member; and Smith and McPherson are first-time candidates. Jennifer Kay is running unopposed for clerk-treasurer on the Republican ticket. She will replace Karen Good, who did not seek re-election after serving in that position for 28 years.

To be eligible to vote, you must be a registered voter, a resident of the Town of Kewanna, and must provide photo identification.

Town Council to Consider Zoning and Fireworks Ordinances

The Kewanna town council will hold a public hearing and begin consideration of adopting the Fulton County Comprehensive Plan, Fulton County Zoning Ordinance, Fulton County Subdivision Ordinance, Fulton County Zone Map and Fulton County Plan Commission Fee ordinance when it meets Thursday, November 1, at the Kewanna town hall, 109 E. Aurora Street.

The Fulton County Area Plan Commission approved the new planning and zoning ordinances and comprehensive plan and zoning map for the entire county when it met Monday evening. The Rochester city council, and Akron, Kewanna and Fulton town councils, as well as the Fulton county commissioners must now approve the ordinances before they take effect.

The Kewanna town council will also hold a third reading and vote on an ordinance regulating fireworks in Kewanna when it meets November 1st.

County Council Considering Five New Taxes

The Fulton County Council introduced and read for the first time ordinances that would enact a total of five new taxes for Fulton County residents when it met Tuesday, October 16. These taxes include:

- A one-percent levy growth income tax to pay for increased expenses in county funds with controlled property tax levies.
- A one-percent property tax relief income tax, which would replace tax, increases for property tax owners.
- A one quarter of one-percent public safety income tax, which could provide additional funding for police, fire, ambulance and other public safety expenses. The public safety tax cannot be implemented unless the first two are.
- A new vehicle excise tax would be imposed on passenger cars, trucks less than 11,000 pounds and motorcycles. Commissioners recommended a \$20 surtax.
- And finally, an annual wheel tax that would cost between \$10 for light trailers and \$40 for heavy trucks.

Kewanna residents are reminded that the burning of leaves during the months of October and November is unlawful. Leaves should be raked to the edge of the street where town employees will pick them up.

Persons violating this ordinance will receive a warning for the first offense. A second and subsequent offense will result in fines ranging from \$25 to \$100.

FSA Committee Elections

Beginning November 2, agricultural producers will vote for candidates to serve on their local USDA Farm Service Agency county committee. FSA county committees make important decisions about disaster and conservations programs, commodity price support loans and payments and other agricultural issues. Anyone who participates or cooperates in a local FSA program and meets other voter criteria can vote.

Voting will take place in Aubeenaubee and Rochester townships in Fulton County. Eligible voters who did not receive ballots by mail, should contact their local FSA office. This year, election ballots must be returned to the local FSA office or postmarked by December 3.

Farm Land Tax Appeal School

An educational program designed for owners of farm land and other working lands will be presented Tuesday, November 20, from 1 to 3:30 p.m. in Indianapolis. Indiana Farm Bureau and the Indiana Ag Law Foundation will present the program entitled "How to Successfully Appeal Your Property Tax Assessment".

Whether you've received your tax bill or not, this program will help you be prepared in the event that you consider filing an appeal.

The cost of the program is being underwritten by IALF, so attendance is free. However, because space is limited to the first 90 people to register prior to the deadline of November 14, pre-registration is required.

Among the topics to be covered during the session are the current assessment process and the environment in which assessments are now being done; information on procedural and evidentiary (or evidence) requirements for assessment appeals; tips on how to present your case; and an examination of issues, trends and appeals particular to ag property. Presenters include attorney David Sues from Bose, McKinney & Evans, whose practice is limited to property tax appeals and other tax issues.
