Community Health Fair Saturday

Time for Spring Clean-Up

Kewanna's annual town wide clean-up day will be Saturday, May 6, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Two 40-yard roll-offs will be set inside the fence at 215 E. Maple Street to receive discarded items from town residents only.

Everyone is encouraged to sort through their accumulated "stuff" in their attics, garages and closets, as well as their outside property, and dispose of it. Items placed in the roll-offs must exclude tires, large appliances (microwaves and televisions are acceptable), hazardous wastes, yard wastes or liquid wastes of any kind. Hazardous wastes can be taken to the Fulton County Recycling Center, 1452 Wentzel Street, Rochester, Saturday, May 20, its next household hazardous waste collection day. County residents can take in their old lawn, photography and pool chemicals, fertilizers and pesticides, paint products, household cleaners, vehicle fluids, glue and solvents for proper disposal.

Redbud Trail Rendezvous, April 29-30

The 16th annual Redbud Trail Rendezvous will be held this weekend, April 29 and 30, at the Fulton County Historical Society grounds north of Rochester. Festival hours will be 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, April 29, and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday, April 30. Hundreds of historic re-enactors will set up camps and live outdoors for the event. They will be demonstrating traditional crafts, frontier life and pioneer skills such as cooking over wood fires, muzzle loading shooting and tomahawk throwing. The event is educational and fun, showing authentic frontier history.

The wedding of Nigel Kohler and Molly Troeger will take place at 1 p.m. Saturday in front of the Chippeway Village Trading Post. This is a real ceremony, not a re-enactment. The groom will be escorted by members of the 1st Royal Regiment of Foot, St. Louis, Missouri, and Haverhill Militia, Roger's Rangers, both of Kokomo and the Royal Navy, Huntington. The bride will be escorted by members of the 42nd Royal Highland Regiment, Detroit, Michigan, and Montgomery's Company of 77th Highland Regiment of Foot, Henderson, Kentucky. The groom is a member of Scots Grey's of the Royal North British Dragoons, headquartered in Akron. The various companies will form the traditional arch through which the bridal couple will walk.

The wedding ceremony will be performed by the groom's father,

Rev. Kohler, of Fort Wayne. Two dragoons will serve as best men. After the wedding, the bridal couple will have to jump over the halberd, a battle-ax carried by the sergeant.

Other re-enacting groups attending and setting up historic camps will be the Prussian Infantry 7th Regiment, Champaign, Illinois; French Milice, Lafayette; 33rd Regiment of Foot and 60th Royal American Regiment, New Castle. All of these military groups are patterned after real companies and regiments that existed during the Seven Years War. Cavalry and artillery may also attend.

The admission charge is \$3 for adults and \$1 for children 6-11. Children five years of age and under will be admitted free. Proceeds enable the historical society to operate the museum and preserve history.

Music and dance will be performed on a stage in the woods, a different program every half hour. Programs include Nan Edwards and Margo Moore, travois dog; Mark Gropp, bagpipes; Frontier Frolic, pioneer dancing called by Shirley Willard; and Liza and Mark Woolever, music, songs and Indian dances. Kim Hoover of Hoots to Howls Wildlife Rehabilitation, Star City, will snow and tell about owls, skunks and bats. Lamb's Artillery will stage a fashion show.

People dressed in authentic pre-1840 outfits will demonstrate many traditional crafts including bow making, pottery, beadwork, leather work, flint knapping, silversmithing, blacksmithing, bladesmithing, pewtersmithing, herbs, scrimshaw and much more. Becky Sampson of Peru will teach basketry. You can make and take home a basket for \$10-\$25.

Trade goods that are 100 percent handmade will be offered for sale or barter in merchants' historic marquee tents and by blanket traders. Many of the traders have Indian ancestry. Traders come from Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Ohio and Missouri.

Muzzle loading shooting contests will be held. The Me-to-cin-yah Long-Rifles will portray woodsmen of the frontier with a camp by the river and conduct pioneer children's games. They will host the Chippeway Village Trading Post.

Foods cooked over wood fires will include ham and beans, vegetable stew, caramel corn, buffalo burgers, apple sausage sandwiches, biscuits and gravy, sassafras tea, fudge and cookies.


The Fulton County Museum and round barn will be open during the festival, at no charge. Volunteers can earn free admission to the Rendezvous by working half a day or hosting a building. To volunteer, call the museum at 574-223-4436. Free parking is provided on the FCHS grounds. The grounds are handicap accessible and there are plenty of benches available to set and rest.





Section 2 - That an ad valorem property tax levy was imposed and the revenues from the levy will be retained in the Fulton County Cumulative Development Fund.

Section 3 - That the maximum rate of levy under Section 2 of this ordinance will not exceed .0333 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation continuing until rate is reduced or rescinded.

Section 4 - That the funds accumulated in the Fulton County Cumulative Capital Development Fund will be to provide funds for the provisions listed in I.C. 36-9-14.5-2.

Section 5 - Notwithstanding Section 4 of this ordinance, funds accumulated in the Fulton County Cumulative Development Fund may be used for purposes other than the purposes stated in Section 4 if the purpose is to protect the public health, welfare or safety in an emergency situation which demands immediate action. Money may be spent under that authority of this emergency section only after the Board of Commissioners issues a declaration that the public health, welfare, or safety is in immediate danger and that the emergency requires the expenditure of money in said fund.

Section 6 - This rate increase takes effect upon approval of the State Board of Tax Commissioners pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 36-9-14.5.

The tax will be levied on all taxable real and personal property within the taxing district and will not exceed \$.0333 (cents) per \$100 of assessed valuation. The proposed fund rate will be levied beginning with taxes due and payable in the year 2007. Taxpayers appearing at such hearing shall have the right to be heard thereon. 


