**FIFTY-FIVE YEARS AGO**

May 25, 1951

The Baptist, Methodist and Christian churches will conduct daily vacation Bible school May 28 through June 8 at the Methodist church. Rev. W.R. Sale will be the director. Mrs. Charles Henning will be the pianist for the school.

Rev. Elium E. Gault graduated May 22 from the Bonebrake Theological Seminary at Dayton, Ohio. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Gault of the Fletchers Lake Community.

Mr. and Mrs. Orrin Silburn and guests enjoyed a leisurely afternoon drive last Sunday. Shortly after their arrival home, a bolt of lightning hit a tree behind their barn, traveled through an electric fence to a control box in the barn and then entered their house through the electric cord on the refrigerator. Mr. Silburn, who was in the chicken house at the time, was stunned for two or three minutes. Flashes of fire danced around the kitchen and a kitchen window was shattered. Fortunately no one suffered any lasting discomfort and power was restored by the REMC.

Lewis Wood, acting postmaster, has announced the approval of an application for a hand-operated automatic canceling machine to be

used in the postoffice here. Delivery is expected within the next 90 days.



**An Outdoor Room to Enjoy the "Main View"**

Bob and Karen Fawcett, owners of the Main View Inn located in North Manchester have recently begun a new chapter in Main View Inn history by adding an additional establishment at the South Shore Golf Course located near Syracuse, Indiana.

Although the new Main View Inn at South Shore Golf Course boasts beautiful views and ample seating, the patio area cried for attention. Realizing this outdoor space could be utilized for additional dining space and entertaining for parties, catered events and wedding receptions, the area was a top priority to renovate for the Fawcetts. "We knew this patio could be an asset to the restaurant. There was a huge half circle flower bed with nothing in it but thistles and invasive ribbon grass. I wanted some landscaping to define the patio area and separate it a bit from the golf course. We wanted lots of color and texture to look at from inside [the restaurant]," Karen Fawcett relates. Referring to the restaurant's large bank of windows that overlook the golf course, Fawcett shared, "The restaurant and patio overlook the 10th green and we didn't want to block the view with the landscaping, so it would need to be three feet tall or less; no trees. We were hoping for a fountain of some kind to add relaxing sound to the patio. I wanted an area that I could sit at for an hour in the afternoon and read a book if I had a break in the middle of the day. Low maintenance plants that would be easy to take care of were needed, too."

Fawcett decided to have local landscape designer Leesa Metzger, Metzger Landscaping and Design, LLC evaluate the project. The North Manchester landscape designer met with Karen Fawcett at South Shore Golf Course to assess the patio area. Fawcett gave Metzger their landscaping "wish list" and it was decided that a weed control application would need to be done immediately. Fawcett said, "I felt comfortable working with Leesa because she has done work for us in the past that we were very pleased with. I knew she would come up with creative

ideas to help us solve the problems we needed taken care of before opening the new restaurant at South Shore".

At the next meeting Metzger shared a landscape plan with the Fawcetts that transformed the area into an outdoor room. The Fawcetts were excited about the plan and wanted to begin the project as soon as possible. The landscape plan Metzger devised addressed all of the Fawcetts' concerns. A border of seven Weigela "Wine 'n Roses" at the back of the bed define the area, create unity and can be easily kept at three feet in height. Season long burgundy leaves of the Weigela add constant color and separate the 10th green from the patio without blocking the grand view of the golf course. A bright color palette of yellow, hot pink, and purple was chosen by the designer to create a dramatic backdrop of color for the patio. A custom boulder fountain that was designed and built by Metzger Landscaping serves as a dramatic focal point while complementing the natural vistas of the surrounding golf course. The underground water reservoir is an essential safety aspect of the fountain, and a smart choice due to its placement in public space. When asked about the choice of fountains, Metzger shares, "I felt a traditional large fountain with a shallow open body of water could be a liability because small children will often be present at events held at the restaurant. ORDINANCE NO. 051606  
 AN ORDINANCE OF FULTON COUNTY ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF THE FULTON COUNTY CUMULATIVE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT FUND # 391

WHEREAS, Public Law 44-1984 (I.C. 36-9-14.5) allows counties to re-establish the county cumulative capital development fund; and

WHEREAS, the County of Fulton by and through its Fiscal Body, the County Council, finds that such fund is necessary and prudent for the financial well being of the county; and

WHEREAS, public hearing was held and public comment was considered;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fulton County Council, of the County of Fulton, State of Indiana, as follows;

Section 1. That there is hereby re-established the Fulton County Cumulative Capital Development Fund pursuant to the purposes of I.C. 36-9-14.5

Section 2. That an ad valorem property tax levy will be imposed and the revenues from the levy will be retained in the Fulton County Cumulative Capital Development Fund.

Section 3. That the maximum rate of levy under Section 2 of this ordinance will not

exceed .0333 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation.

Section 4. That the funds accumulated in the Fulton County Cumulative Capital Development Fund will be to provide funds for the provisions listed in I.C. 36-9-14.5-2.

Section 5. Notwithstanding Section 4 of this ordinance, funds accumulated in the Fulton County Cumulative Development Fund may be used for purposes other than the purposes stated in Section 4 if the purpose is to protect the public health, welfare or safety in an emergency situation which demands immediate action. Money may be spent under that authority of this emergency section only after the Board of Commissioners issues a declaration that the public health, welfare, or safety is in immediate danger and that the emergency requires the expenditure of money in said fund.

Section 6. This fund takes effect upon approval of the State Board of Tax Commissioners pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 36-9-14.5.


