## Police Department to Issue Tickets to Violators

Town marshal, Dennis Price, reminded the Kewanna town council when it met Thursday evening that his department will start issuing tickets to curfew violators and residents who allow trash, junk cars and overgrown vegetation to accumulate on their property.

Bob Murphy of R. P. Murphy and Associates conducted a public hearing concerning the town's plans to apply for a Community Focus Fund grant to upgrade the sewage treatment plant.

Tony Pesaresi gave the fire department's monthly report noting six town responses, all medical, and four township responses, two fire and two medical. The department also hosted its annual pancake and sausage breakfast during May. He also reported that the local department and the Rochester Fire Department will take part in a fire fighting drill on Kewanna's Main Street during June.

The police department report revealed one traffic arrest, 12 traffic warnings, two criminal arrests, 59 calls answered and 1,859 miles patrolled. The department's standard operation procedures were approved as proposed.

The town superintendent reported the repair of a fluoride line at one of the well houses and an air line at the sewage treatment plant. A sink hole in a town tile was repaired at the local park. Water samples were taken to South Bend to be tested for arsenic. Sand was removed from the former Beattie lot at Main and Logan and dirt and stone was hauled in. The dirt will be leveled and seeded. A town tile in front of the Charlotte Robbins residence was unplugged to drain standing water. The tile will be replaced and catch basins installed to take care of the ponding water. The water works pumped a total of 1,275,800 gallons of water during May.

## Historical Power Show, June 16-18

Organizers are gearing up for the Fulton County Historical Power Show to be held June 16-18 on the Fulton County Historical Society grounds north of Rochester. Show hours are 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday, June 16 and 17 and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday, June 18. Admission is \$3 for adults, age 12 and over, and free for children 11 years of age and under. Free parking and tram rides will be available.

The three-day event will host exhibitors of antique tractors, lawn tractors, hit-n-miss engines, farm equipment and antique trucks. Vendors of a variety of foods, crafts, flea market items and swap parts will also be available on the grounds. The museum, round barn and Living History Village of Loyal will be open during the festival, free of charge.

The show will host the Northern Indiana Two-Cylinder Club and the Custom Club International summer convention. Featured this year will be all John Deere equipment with special emphasis on the John Deere "G".

John Deere tractors will be featured in the garden tractor section as well as a special exhibit from Howard Lease, Rochester, with his homemade tractor. Members of the Vintage Garden Tractors Club of America with garden tractors from a five-state region will also be exhibiting during the show. A variety of tractors will be at the show including John Deere, International Harvester, Farmall H, Allis Chalmers, Ford, Case, Minneapolis Moline, Massie Harris, Oliver, Cockshutt, McCormick Deering, etc.

The show will honor Bailey's Hardware, Rochester, for 80 plus years of service in Fulton County. The store has been in the same location since 1928 and was a dealer of John Deere farm tools. The hardware store is unique and reminiscent of the old type of hardware stores with its old wood floor that creaks as you walk across it and the displays mounted on the walls.

Food vendors will provide something for everyone's taste buds: sandwiches (hot and cold), onion rings, kettle corn, ice cream, elephant ears, cotton candy and much more. The Historical Society will serve a breakfast buffet at 7 a.m. each morning that will include biscuits and gravy, scrambled eggs, ham, fruit and beverage. Lunch will also be served in the air-conditioned community room and will consist of submarine sandwiches and homemade pie.

Activities during the show will include a parade of trucks and tractors each day at noon. Tractor games will take place all three days. Games for the kids are also being planned. The public address system is being provided

## Crop Reporting Deadline

Local Farm Service Agency offices are currently busy taking acreage reports from farmers. The deadline for filing reports of the 2006 planted crop acres is July 17.

The reporting of these acres is a requirement of the Direct and Countercyclical Payment program, as well as for Conservation Reserve Program acreage and in order to be eligible for commodity loans, LDP's and the Non-Insured Assistance Program. Reports filed after July 17 will require the payment of a late-filing fee.






## FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO June 8, 1961


