Spark in the Park at Akron

The 8th annual "Spark in the Park" will take place Saturday, July 15, from 1 to 9 p.m. in Pike Memorial Park, Akron. This free outdoor Christian concert will feature two-time Dove Award winning singer/song writer, Chris Rice; The Browns; Morris Mott; Reconciliation; and Micky Ray & Zach. The featured speaker will be Michael Skupin from the CBS hit reality show, "Survivor". Michael is determined to reach people's souls with a very encouraging and endearing message of faith.

On April 20, 1999, two students walked nonchalantly into Columbine High School, fired from a multi-gun arsenal and lobbed homemade bombs throughout the school. They killed 12 students and one teacher before committing suicide. The nation, the state and the Akron community watched in horror. From this horror, a small group of individuals were moved to respond to the tragedy. Thus, "Spark in the Park" was born. Taking advantage of the beautiful town park, the group provided a free concert, free food and a safe, clean environment for Akron and the surrounding communities to worship and fellowship. Eight years later, this event continues to serve as an enjoyable afternoon of great Christian music, games and activities, food, fun and fellowship. The event is provided by area churches, which assist in fundraisers, help secure donations from the private and business sector and grants from area businesses and community groups.

Army Offering Referral Bonus

The U.S. Army is now offering a \$1,000 recruiting referral bonus to retired soldiers.

The new bonus pays retired members of the Active Army and Army Reserve a \$1,000 lump sum for referring individuals who enlist in either of these components, complete basic training, and graduate from advanced individual training.

Those eligible to receive this referral bonus include Reserve members who have transferred to the Retired Reserve but have not yet reached 60 years of age.

The individuals referred under this program may not be an immediate family member, and the retired soldier making the referral cannot be serving in a recruiting or retention assignment or as a Junior ROTC instructor.



Free Wireless Hotspots at Rochester Library

The Fulton County Public Library now has wireless access to the Internet available to users who have their own wireless devices. To use the hotspots, your device must be 802.11 a, b or g compatible and have the ability for you to register as a user. To register, you sign on as a guest using your email address and checking a box that you agree to abide by the library's wireless access policy.

The hotspots are not secure so it is advisable that you have a personal firewall and up-to-date antivirus on your wireless device.

The hotspots cover most of the inside of the library and some areas of the Arboretum. Wireless access is available during library hours only. At this time printing is not available over the wireless network.

Contest Aimed at Raising Awareness about Disease

Meningococcal (me-nin-kok-ul) disease is a serious illness caused by bacteria that can infect the blood or areas around the brain and spinal cord. Infection can lead to brain damage, disability, and rapid death. Even if treated, 10-14% of people who get meningococcal disease will die from it. Of the survivors, 11-19% lose their arms or legs, become deaf or brain damaged, or suffer other complications.

College students living in dormitories are more likely to get the meningococcal disease than other college and university students as a whole. To educate college freshmen, the California Distance Learning Health Network (CDLHN) is spreading the word about the importance of meningococcal vaccination.

CDLHN is inviting teens between the ages of 15-19 to submit an original Public Service Announcement (PSA) that will encourage "dorm-bound" college freshmen to get their vaccine. The CDLHN has created a web page highlighting the disease, prevention measures, and details about the Teen PSA contest.

High school seniors and college-aged teens are encouraged to create their own 30-second PSA on meningococcal disease prevention and submit it to CDLHN. Selected PSAs will be featured at www.gotmyshot.org and www.cdlhn.com and on an upcoming DVD in August.




