## Caston Students Return to Classes Au- gust 16

The 2006-2007 school year begins Wednesday, August 16, for all students, K-12, attending the Caston Corporation Schools. Classes for elementary students begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 3:12 p.m. Junior-senior high classes begin at 8:35 a.m. and end at 3:20 p.m. (Professional early release days will be October 12, November 2, December 13, January 23, February 27 and May 4, at which time students will be dismissed at 12:50 p.m.)

All corporation buses will run on Wednesday, August 16. Drivers plan their routes to arrive at school by 8:25 a.m. Transportation for half-day kindergarten students will also be provided one way beginning August 16.

Students enrolling in kindergarten must be five (5) years old and students enrolling in the first grade must be six (6) years old on or before August 1, 2006. Parents need to provide certification from a physician that their child has been properly immunized and also they need to present a valid birth certificate if these have not previously been provided to the school. Effective July 1, 1999, the immunization list must also include hepatitis B.

Students in grades K-6 who are new students or did not enroll by mail may do so at the Caston Elementary office beginning Monday, August 7, through Wednesday, August 9. Hours are the same as listed below for the junior-senior high school enrollment.

Students in grades seven (7) through twelve (12) will enroll at the Guidance Office on the following schedule:

Monday, August 7 - all students (including new students), 9 to 11:30 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m.

Tuesday, August 8 - all students, 12:01 to 3:30 p.m. and 5 to 6:45 p.m.

Wednesday, August 9 - all students, 9 to 11:30 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m.

Seventh grade orientation will be held at 7 p.m. Tuesday, August 8, in the cafeteria.

Book rental fees will be: kindergarten, \$50; Grade 1, \$95; Grade 2, \$100; Grade 3, \$105; Grade 4, \$90; Grades 5 and 6, \$85; and Grades 7 and 8, \$120. Fees for grades 9-12 vary depending on classes taken. Rental fees are to be paid prior to the first day of school.

All students are to pay fees at the Bookstore beginning Monday, August 7, through Wednes-

day, August 9. The hours are 9 to 11:30 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m. on Monday and Wednesday and 12:01 to 3 p.m. and 5 to 6:45 p.m. Tuesday.

Lunch will be served beginning Wednesday, August 16, at a cost of \$1.70 for students in grades 1-6 and \$1.85 for students in grades 7-12. Breakfast will be served at a cost of \$1.25. Each student will establish a renewable lunch account for meal fees. Meal fees may be credited to the student account in weekly, monthly, six or nine week, semi-annual or annual payments. Some students may be eligible for reduced lunch fees based on the guidelines listed below. Applications for this assistance will be available in the bookstore.

Students attending vocational education at the Century Career Center and special education classes in Logansport will begin on Tuesday, August 15. Special education students will be picked up at their homes by the special education bus (No. 041) and will be transported directly to Logansport to arrive there at approximately 8 a.m. Beginning Wednesday, August 16, Century Career Center students will attend classes at Caston in the morning and will be transported back to Caston at approximately 3:15. Fees for Century Career Center and special education students attending Logansport schools are payable to the respective schools they attend.

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 restricts the release of most information about students and restricts the availability of student records. Only directory information may be made public with parental consent. Directory information includes student names, parent's names, addresses and telephone numbers. If you do not want such information released, please request this by notifying the respective principals. By Indiana statute, Armed Forces recruiting representatives are allowed access to directory information.

Teacher orientation and in-service will be held Monday, August 14 and Tuesday, August 15.

Should the school corporation find it necessary to delay school or dismiss early, the official radio stations for notification are Rochester WROI 92.1, Logansport WSAL 102.3 or Logansport Hoosier Country 103.7. 

**Homeowners Get More Protections under New Law**

Attorney General Steve Carter Unfortunately, Indiana has one of the highest home foreclosure rates in the country.

Many families have fallen on hard times and the loss of the home due to an unexpected event such as a family illness or unemployment can be devastating. To make matters worse, there are people out there who prey on families that are simply doing all they can to save their homes from foreclosure.

If you're in danger of losing your home, you may have been tempted to respond to advertisements claiming "We Buy Homes". Although these offers may seem like a tempting way to avoid foreclosure, they may end badly for the homeowners.

The offers are led by "foreclosure consultants" who target homeowners who have been threatened with foreclosure. Homeowners pay foreclosure consultants with hopes that the foreclosure consultant can stop or delay foreclosure. In reality, the mortgages are not paid by the company and the original homeowners ends up losing the home in spite of the fees paid to

the company. In order to better regulate "foreclosure consultants" the Indiana Attorney General's office supported a change in state law which provides homeowners with more protections when facing foreclosure.

These new changes in state law empower the homeowner and place disclosure requirements on companies that engage in these types of activities. The law now:

- Requires various written disclosures to inform homeowners about significant aspects of the service they are purchasing
- Provides a three-day right to cancel
- Prohibits a company or individual from obtaining power of attorney from the homeowner. In some cases, homeowners were unknowingly appointing the foreclosure consultant to act on the homeowners behalf.
- Requires foreclosure consultants to obtain a surety

bond of at least \$25,000

The legislation makes it clear that a violation also constitutes a deceptive act under the Deceptive Consumer Sales Act, which allows the attorney general to seek remedies including injunction, restitution, and reimbursement of the attorney general's cost.

If you or a loved one is facing foreclosure, seek help from a reputable organization with a proven track record of success. Before you enter into any agreements with a foreclosure consultant, carefully read and understand all paperwork you're signing.

Victims of foreclosure scams should file a complaint with the attorney general at <http://www.attorneygeneral.in.gov> or call 1-800-382-5516. The attorney general's office stands ready to pursue action against scammers who take advantage of vulnerable Hoosiers.

Notice is hereby given the taxpayers of Akron Carnegie Public Library, Fulton County, Indiana that the proper officers of said Library, will conduct a public hearing at Akron Carnegie Public Library on the 2007 budget on August 7, 2006, at 6:00 p.m. Following this meeting, any ten or more taxpayers may object to a budget, tax rate, or tax levy by filing an objection petition with the proper officers of the political subdivision within seven days after the hearing. The objection petition must identify the provisions of the budget, tax rate, or tax levy that taxpayers object to. If a petition is filed, the political subdivision shall adopt with its budget a finding concerning the objections filed and testimony presented. 

### Boat Owners Intend To Sail On Despite Gas Prices

(NAPS)—Boat owners say high gas prices won't sink their plans this summer. However, according to a new survey, higher prices will have them easing off the throttle more often.

Like other motorists, boat enthusiasts are caught in the wake of high fuel prices—especially those who pay a premium to gas up at marinas. But many boat owners indicate they are willing to "pay to play," saying gas prices would have to nearly double before they change their lifestyle.

The survey, conducted by The Brandware Group, Inc. for Nationwide Mutual Insurance, indicated that two-thirds of boat owners reported high fuel prices would not cause them to use their boats less often. In fact, boat owners are willing to pay about \$2.70 more per gallon for fuel before they will consider docking their boats.

"When talking with our customers about boating we learned that while they're concerned about rising fuel prices, the passion they have for their boats overrides those concerns," said Greg Blanchard, Nationwide's vice president of Specialty Products.

The survey also showed boat owners intended to be on the water just as often as last summer—about 20 times—but expect to run their engines about 25 minutes less per trip. The sailors surveyed said they spend 28 percent of their total leisure time on the water.

Experts say that with high fuel costs putting a strain on

boat owners' wallets, boat owners should make sure they have the right protection against the unexpected so they don't get hit with burdensome repair or replacement costs.

"Protecting your investments by making sure they are insured to value is an important step in protecting your lifestyle," said Blanchard. "The money crunch really hits home if something happens and you don't have adequate insurance to repair or replace your baby."

According to the survey, one in five power boat owners and one in three bass boat owners do not have insurance on their boat. Of those with insurance, about 35 percent don't have liability coverage. About 40 percent of power boat owners and 53 percent of bass boat owners don't have collision coverage. About one in five power boat owners and a quarter of all bass boat owners would rather take their chances than pay to fully insure their boats.


#### Cajun Fried Soft-Shell Crabs

- 4 cups flour

According to a 2000 study in *The New England Journal of Medicine*, women are three times more likely than men to suffer from continuous knee pain and three times less likely than men to undergo needed knee replacement surgery. They also have worse joint function when they do turn to surgery, which suggests that they wait longer before getting treatment. Why are women waiting? Women are delaying surgery for a number of social and psychological reasons, from worries about caring for their families during recovery to myths about the surgery itself. Women may sometimes avoid knee replacement because of the conventional wisdom that surgery is only recommended when discomfort turns into



disability that the patient can't tolerate. Yet a 1999 study in *Arthritis & Rheumatism* found that those who get early treatment tend to have less post-operative pain and better knee function after surgery.
