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West Nile Virus in Fulton County

The Fulton County Health Department has received word that a blue jay submitted from Fulton County has tested positive for West Nile Virus.

The health department would like to remind everyone of general steps that can be taken to prevent West Nile Virus:

- Avoid outdoor activities between dusk and dawn when most mosquitoes are active.
- Wear long sleeve shirts and long pants when outdoors.
- Use mosquito repellent that contains Deet and follow the directions on the label. Deet can be toxic if overused. Avoid repellents containing concentrations of Deet greater than 10% on children and 30% on adults.
- Fix holes in your screens and make sure they are tightly attached to all your windows and doors.

Mosquitoes always develop in water, but the type of breeding areas depends on the species of mosquito. Common breeding places are flood waters, ditches, pools and edges of the lake. Mosquitoes may also develop in tree cavities, old tires, birdbaths, and guttering -- in other words in anything that holds water. The extensive breeding of mosquitoes in such containers has often contributed to disease outbreaks. The entire life cycle of a mosquito may be completed in five to ten days.

The most effective control of disease carrying mosquitoes around the home is to prevent them from breeding. This can be done by eliminating or altering breeding sites as follows:

- Destroy or dispose of tin cans, old tires, or any other artificial water containers. If you can't dispose of tires before rainy weather arrives, drill holes in them so water won't stand in the tires. Smash tin cans or keep them in a covered trash container.
- Make weekly inspections of your outdoor flower containers. Do not let water stand in the saucer under clay pots and check the soil to make sure it is loosened to permit the water to penetrate the soil instead of forming a stagnant pool on the surface for mosquitoes to breed in.
- Change the water in your birdbath and wading pools once or twice a week. Drain wading pools when not in use.

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Conservancy District to Hold Special Meeting

The Lake Bruce Conservancy District will hold a special meeting Friday, August 4, at 10 a.m. at the offices of its engineering firm, Wightman-Petri, 4703 Chester Dr., Elkhart. The agenda will include property acquisition and easements, and preliminary discussions of sewer ordinances.

The district will conduct its regular meeting and a budget hearing for the 2007 budget Thursday, August 10, at 7 p.m. in the community room of the Kewanna-Union Township Fire Station.

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- Keep rain gutters unclogged and flat roofs dry.
- Drain and fill stagnant pools, puddles, and ditches or swampy places around the property and home.
- Keep margins of small ponds and lagoons clear of vegetation.
- Place tight fitting covers over septic tanks, rain barrels and tubs where water is stored. Be sure to have a working septic system. A failed septic system with standing sewage is an ideal breeding site for mosquitoes.
- Fill holes in trees with sand or drain them.

In addition to the control of breeding sites, it may be necessary to control adult mosquitoes that migrate from surrounding areas. The adults like to rest in vegetation. Therefore, do not allow weeds to grow uncontrolled near your home. Keep weeks mowed on nearby lots. Leave insecticide to trained personnel.

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Caston Athletic Tickets on Sale

Caston all-sports tickets, ten- and five-punch tickets will go on sale Monday, August 7, in the athletic director's office. They will also be sold at the first varsity football game on August 18 and the first volleyball game on August 15. Starting August 14, they will be sold in the bookstore.

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Do Not Call Law Upheld

Less than three months after hearing oral arguments in an appeal challenging Indiana's Do Not Call Law, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 7th Circuit has ruled that the law is constitutional.

"The privacy rights of those who choose to reduce telemarketing calls is in jeopardy each time a challenge and an appeal is filed against the law", Indiana Attorney General Steve Carter said. "The ruling is a great victory and after consistent legal successes in state and federal courts, we hope that telemarketers are beginning to understand that citizens have rights to protect themselves from unwanted sales calls."

The fourth quarter registration deadline for the Indiana Do Not Call registry is August 22. Numbers registered by midnight EDT will be placed on the October 1, 2006 list. Registration is available online at www.attorneygeneral.IN.gov or by calling 1-888-834-9969.

There are more than 1.7 million phone numbers registered on the list, protecting the residential privacy of more than 3.5 million Hoosiers.

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House Numbering is Important

In the event of an emergency, are your home or business address numbers visible to emergency responders? It is difficult for emergency vehicles, utility trucks, postal and delivery trucks to find homes and businesses whose address numbers are not properly posted. Firefighters, emergency vehicles and personnel may need to find your home quickly should an emergency occur. Be sure your home or business has its numbers posted and that they are clearly visible from the street. Follow these general hints to help ensure your numbers are visible:

- Use numbers at least 4" high
- Use numbers that contrast with the color of your home or business

- Post directly on your house, business or garage, by the street on a post or sign, on the mailbox, on the curb or anywhere that it can be seen from the road
- Ensure that trees or shrubs do not block the view of the numbers
- Check to see if your numbers are visible from the middle of your street/road
- Your numbers should also be visible at night.

Encourage your family, friends and neighbors to post their houses.

A clearly posted house number can save precious time should an emergency occur!

Former Resident and Head of Charity Organization Dies

Thurl Metzger, a Kosciusko County native who farmed and worked as a history teacher in Kewanee before heading Heifer International, passed away recently at his home in Little Rock, Arkansas. He was 90 years old.

Metzger began his work with Heifer International as an unpaid volunteer in 1946. Five years later, he became the group's executive director, a position he held for 30 years.

Heifer International, based in Little Rock, has provided livestock and agricultural training to people in 128 counties in an effort to end hunger and poverty. People who receive a heifer through the project are asked to give the animal's first offspring to another family, which is asked to do the same.

As Heifer's executive director,

Metzger raised money, helped train volunteers, and personally delivered livestock to war-torn and Third World countries.

Jerry Aaker, a Montana resident who worked with Metzger notes, "You have to remember back in the 50s, it wasn't a very popular time to be sending aid to Russia. He ran the program on a shoestring. He was very courageous. He would personally go over there to make sure it all went smoothly."

Metzger was the non-profit's first executive director and worked in South Korea, India, Europe and Africa, visiting 70 countries in all.

According to Aaker, they had to hire a whole staff of people to accomplish what Metzger had been doing when he retired.

The new Thurl Metzger Education Building will be dedicated tomorrow at the Heifer Ranch near Perryville.

The current president and CEO called Metzger a "true pioneer

whose leadership and guidance have enabled Heifer to touch the lives of so many families and communities around the world."

You had to snake your way along the brick-laid street past deserted storefronts. Like a lot of towns, businesses have moved to the outskirts and strip malls. We stopped to take a picture of an abandoned Greyhound Station. You could just feel the history.

Too bad the old building couldn't talk!

Travel on Friday went well - not really much traffic. We took a detour into Hot Springs, Arkansas, in the afternoon thinking we might make it our stop for the night. Diane had reported golf courses and antique stores when she surveyed the area a couple of weeks ago, but we only found one golf course (a country club) and one antique store so we decided to keep heading south for awhile. We ended up in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, for the night. We located a golf course but it looked like they were hosting an outing or getting ready for one so Joe opted not to check it out. Besides, it was about 100 degrees in the shade! By this time, we had traveled about 1,000 miles.

Saturday morning, we headed on down US 271 for Flint, Texas, just south of Tyler and arrived at John's about mid-morning. (Keep in mind that Texas is in the Central Time Zone). It was raining again (or should I say still) but they really needed it. We saw several areas along the roadside that had burned off due to the dry conditions and there was a burn ban in effect in the area. The rain cooled the weather off from the low hundreds to the low nineties, so it wasn't too bad while we were there. In fact, I kept a sweater with me most of the time because everyone had their air conditioners turned down pretty low.

In the afternoon, we visited with Kirk and enjoyed the view from his gazebo and deck that he built around his swimming pool. I think Kirk inherited all of Grandpa Good's carpenter abilities. It's a cinch Joe didn't nor did our son, Jeff. We laugh because whenever anything needs repaired or replaced around Jeff's house - he watches the kids and his wife, Tonya, does the work - everything from laying a new wood laminate floor to building a patio and replacing the garbage disposal. Around our house, we just call a repairman/carpenter. It's usually much cheaper in the long run and saves Joe a lot of aggravation!

Kirk and Kathy joined us for pork chops and veggies on the grill Saturday evening and we visited until almost midnight. I don't know about Kirk and

Kathy, but John, Lynette, Joe and I are not usually night owls.

Joe, John and Kirk headed for the golf course Sunday morning and Lynette and I invaded Holly's home. She and the kids (Hampton, age 8, and Emma, age 4 1/2) were still trying to catch up on their sleep as they had had a later night than even ours. Holly spent Saturday at a baby shower in Dallas and did not get home until about midnight and to bed until 2:30 a.m. Her husband Kevin, who is a doctor, was in Denver, Colorado attending a medical meeting.

Lynette then took me on a tour of the Flint/Tyler area. For being a recent transplant, she is very knowledgeable of her new hometown.

Flint (population 700 according to the 2000 census) is located at the junction of FM (farm to market) roads 2868, 346 and 2493 in Smith County. The site was named for a local landowner, Robert P. Flynt in 1882 when it became a stop for the Kansas & Gulf Short Line Railroad. The post office began operation in 1887 as "Flint", when the postmaster misspelled the name on application forms. In 1890 the settlement had a general store, three cotton gins, a physician, and a population of 25. By 1902, some 100 local families were engaged in truck farming and they reportedly shipped 85 railroad cars of tomatoes, as well as large amounts of cabbage, cantaloupes and peaches. That's a lot of fruit and veggies! (We saw several peach orchards on our way into Tyler.) Flint also boasted a blacksmith shop, a telephone exchange, a telegraph service and two mercantile companies. By 1914, the population peaked at 450 and farmers in the area shipped record amounts of nursery stock, fruit and tomatoes. The town had six general stores, a bank and a newspaper. I can't image six general stores in a town that size! By 1925, the population had dropped to 200, was recorded at 150 in the 1990 census, but had risen to 700 by the 2000 census. I have a feeling there will be another big increase in inhabitants by the time the next census rolls around.

Tyler is the county seat for Smith County and is named for

U.S. President John Tyler in recognition of his support for Texas' admission to the United States. As of the 2000 census, Tyler had a population of 83,650 but had a projected growth to 101,000 by 2005 making it one of the fastest growing cities in the United States. John and Lynette report about 10,000 people are relocating to Tyler every year and 100,000 people commute into Tyler daily to work.

Tyler is known as the Rose Capital of America because of its large role in the rose-growing industry; about 20% of commercial rose bushes produced in the U.S. are grown in Tyler and Smith County and more than half of the rose bushes are packaged and shipped from the area. It boasts the nation's largest municipal rose garden and hosts the Texas Rose Festival each October. In addition to its role in the rose-growing industry, Tyler is the headquarters for Brookshire Grocery Company, which operates Brookshire's and Super I Foods supermarkets in four states. Lynette is employed at the Brookshire store in Bullard, just south of Flint. Tyler Pipe is one of the area's biggest employers. We drove by the facility our last day there. It covers acres and acres of ground!

After scouting the area, we returned to Holly's where I was given a tour of her beautiful new home. Then we enjoyed lunch (Mexican) and a little shopping. That evening, we met Holly and the kids for dinner at a very good cafeteria and more visiting.

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
