The Lake Bruce Conservancy District board of directors met Thursday, November 9, in the community room of the Kewanna-Union Township Fire Station for its monthly meeting. All five directors as well as nine freeholders were present.

The minutes of the October meeting and treasurer's report were read and approved.

Chairman Norm Steigely commented on correspondence received by the district during the past month. He also reported that he had met with Steve Tennant of the dredging company Tuesday and was told they would start excavating soon. It will take approximately a week to build the holding site and approximately five weeks to do the dredging, depending on weather conditions.

The district's treasurer, Dave Foust, reported that after researching several commercial banks, he has selected First Source in which to place the district's funds as it offers interest and more services.

Gerald Porter and Steigely are scheduled to meet with Gwen White of the Department of Natural Resources and a representative from Weed Patrol Thursday, November 30, to discuss the LARE plans for weed control in 2007. Expanded DNR requirements in 2006 caused a delay of approximately six weeks in weed treatment, costing lake users about half of the season. The district plans to evaluate the advantages of staying with the program or going back to financing the weed control on its own.

Steve Fralish of Wightman-Petrie gave a report on the progress of the sewer project. He noted that design and administrative efforts and issues pertaining to land acquisition are

proceeding well. Revisions on the contract with the engineering company were required by Rural Development. This revised agreement was signed by the district on the advice of its attorney.

The next meeting of the conservancy board of directions will be held December 14 at 7 p.m. at the same location. The meeting is open to all freeholders and interested parties. A special meeting was set for 10 a.m. Monday, December 11, at the Hoosier Hide-a-way, Lake Bruce, to start preliminary work on ordinances for the district's sewer project.

An open house was held Saturday, November 11, at the Hoosier Hide-a-way with engineers from Wightman-Petrie and AirVac on hand to explain where vacuum pits would be located, listen to residents' concerns, and make changes where necessary. It was a very successful meeting with approximately 60 property owners in attendance. Many suggestions were made that helped improve the plan. The district will try to have updated drawings for public view at all of its monthly meetings.

The Kewanna-Union Township Volunteer Fire Department recently took deliveries on a new rescue squad and tanker.


The squad is a new 2005 16-foot crew/command rescue vehicle with a Chevrolet chassis. The squad, a demo unit, features a full width cab to body opening, three personnel crew seating, 10 KW Smart Power generator,

telescopic quartz lights, 3,000 watt light tower and safety vision rear vision camera.

The new tanker features a 3,500 stainless steel elliptical tank on a 2007 Freightliner M2 tandem chassis. It also includes a Darley

350 gallon per minute PTO pump, electric rear dump valve, side dump valves, electric Fold-A-Tank system, rear camera system, and SCBA side storage compartments.

Boy or Girl?

While it is fun to learn the sex of the baby with an ultrasound, the test is really needed for more critical information.

Using sound waves to visualize the developing fetus, health professionals can determine size, weight, and age; check for multiple babies; diagnose certain body structure defects, detect missing limbs or certain internal organ malformations.

Routine ultrasounds are considered safe for both baby and mother. Most often the results reassure the parents that everything is running smoothly for their baby. Occasionally, false positives may result.

When a real problem is detected, it gives the physician advance notice on how to best protect the baby and mother.



Local Youth Donates Hair to Locks of Love

Taylor Smith, daughter of Chuck and Janine Smith of Kewanna, got a hair cut Saturday, but this wasn't just any hair cut. Taylor decided last February that she wanted to let her hair grow so she could donate her locks to Locks of Love. Catherine, a stylist at Regis Salon in the Logansport Mall, is shown here as she takes 10 inches off of Taylor's hair.

When Taylor learned about Locks of Love and how it helps children who have lost their hair due to chemotherapy treatments, she decided she wanted to be a donor. Taylor plans to let her hair grow so she can donate again.

Locks of Love is a non-profit organization that provides hairpieces to financially disadvantaged children under the age 18 suffering from long-term medical hair loss. It meets a unique need for children by using donated hair to create the highest quality hair prosthetics. Most of the children helped by Locks of Love have lost their hair due to a medical condition called alopecia areata, which has no known cause or cure, as well as chemotherapy treatment. The prostheses help to restore the children's self-esteem and confidence, enabling them to face the world and their peers.

Locks of Love was connected with a for-profit wig retailer when it first began. In 1997, the organization obtained its non-profit status from the Internal Revenue Service, formed a board of directors, and began operating

as a charity with its own bylaws. This effort was spearheaded by Madonna Coffman, a retired cardiac nurse who had a great deal of volunteer experience working for not-for-profits in Florida.

When Mrs. Coffman was in her 20s, she developed alopecia after receiving a hepatitis vaccination. With medications, she recovered. However, 15 years later, her 4-year-old daughter developed alopecia and lost her hair. According to Coffman, it was difficult to deal with her hair loss, but her daughter's was ten times worse. It was at that time that Coffman quit all other charity work and took on Locks of Love as a full time volunteer.

The number of hairpieces produced by Locks of Love has

increased significantly since its inception, from 21 the first year to over 2,000. Locks of Love has recipients in all 50 states and Canada and is working towards its goal of helping every financially disadvantaged child suffering from long-term hair loss.






